### What is Tripura known for?

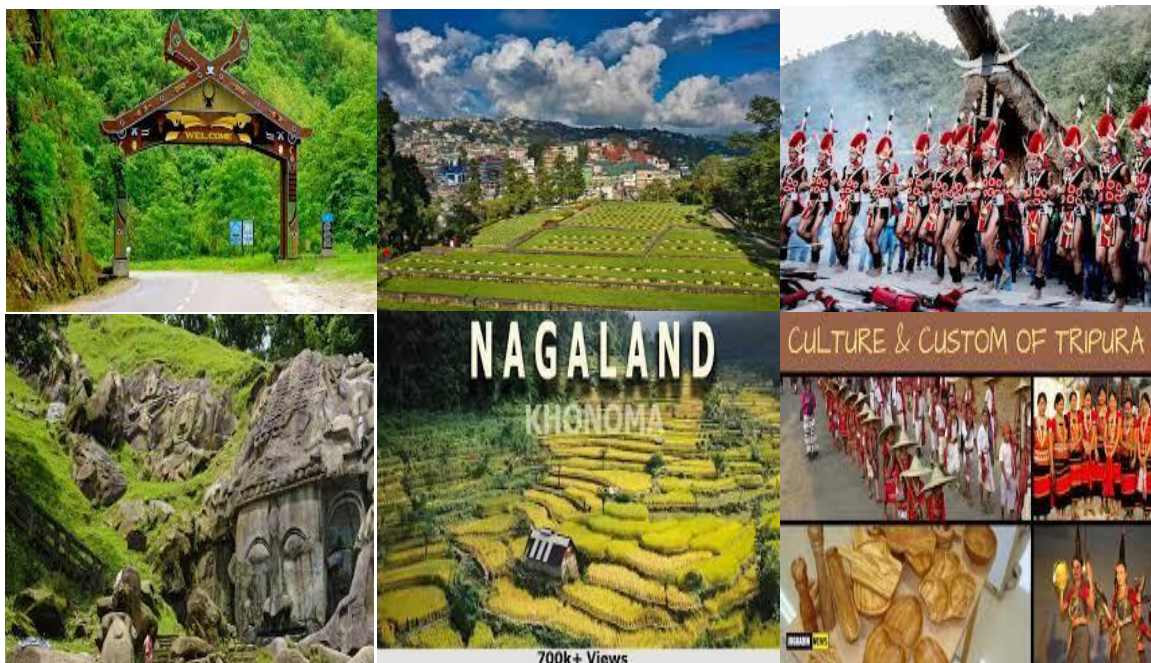
Tripura is famous for its cultivations, tea-plantations, beautiful gardens, toy trains and much more. This state is also popular for its tribe culture and food.

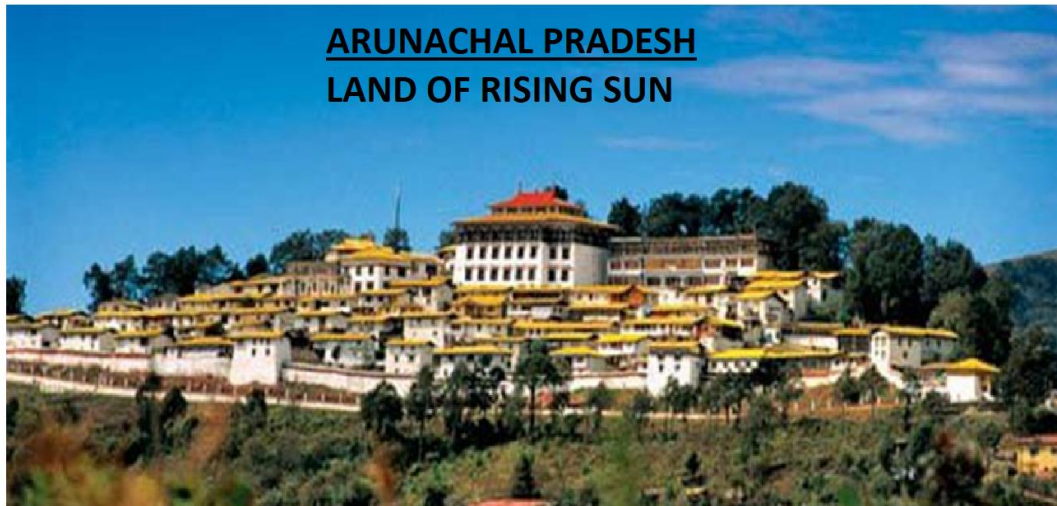

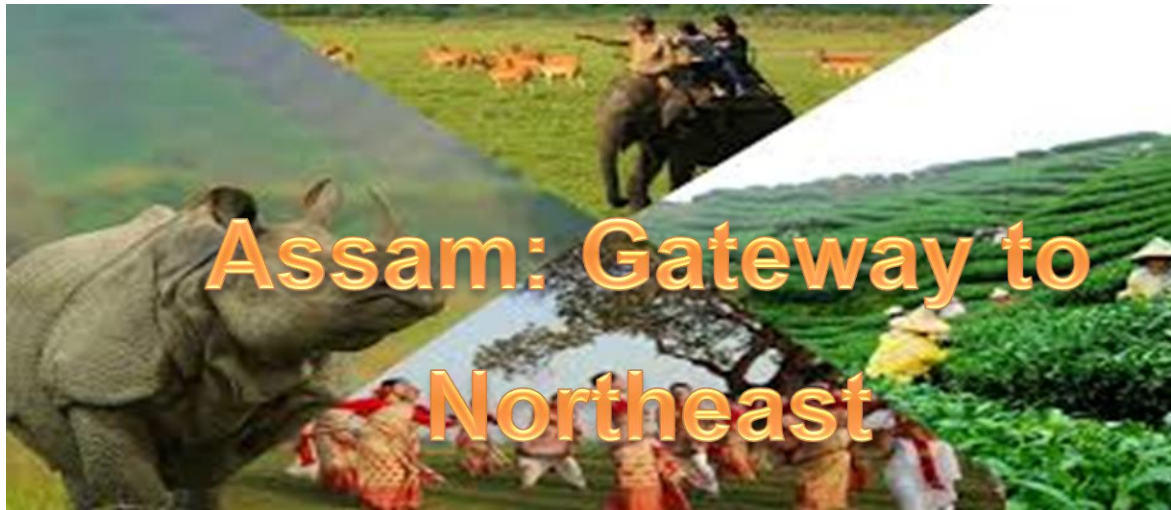
